Lecture celebrates Le Corbusier Day

THE Chandigarh College of Architecture observed the annual Le Corbusier Day today by organising a lecture on, 'Open Space Planning and Cities—A Comparative Analysis of Lutyen's New Delhi and Le Corbusier's Chandigarh,' delivered by Prof Ravinder Bhan, land-scape architect and ecological planner.

In an audio-visual talk, he traced the history of open space planning from historical examples like Mughal Gardens, Fatehpur Sikri and Mandu in India and cities like Venice in Europe. He emhasised that to be meaningful, open space planning must have three major aspects — scale relationship, diversity and articulation of elements and fillers.

He stressed that the open spaces in cities must be planned bearing in mind their maintenance problems. For instance, he said, the current trend to have large expenses of grassy areas is not climatically suitable in the semi-hot and arid climate of north India, which has a hot summer.
